Ocean Observation Operations Update

 A research cruise is currently underway to research HABs in the Northern Bering Sea. Chukchi Sea and Beaufort Sea. This WHOI-led cruise aboard the R/V Norseman II is the first-ever extensive survey of HABs in this region.

Nome real time reporting wave buoy is in the water for 2022. The Coastal Data Information System (CDIP) wave buoy 241 was deployed on August 1st offshore of the Port of Nome, and is now streaming real time information on significant wave height, wave direction, wave period, and sea surface temperature on the AOOS Ocean Data Explorer Data Portal, the CDIP website, and through the National Data Buoy Center (NDBC) website.

2022 Survey "Our AOOS funded whale glider was deployed last week [July 30,2022]. This glider is officially known as unit 595, but we like to call her "Loki." Everything is functional and the glider is happily steaming to Barrow for recovery sometime this September." (Quote: Hank Statscewich, UAF-CFOS), The Chukchi Sea Marine Mammal Glider, supported by AOOS since 2013, provides one of the longest geospatial time series documenting unprecedented changes in the Arctic. Real time oceanographic data from Loki are streaming live through the AOOS Ocean Data Explorer Data Portal. Near real time passive acoustic detections of Arctic marine mammals are viewable on WHOI's Website: Robots4Whales, Chukchi Sea, Arctic Summer 2022.

Alaska Ocean Acidification Network

The Alaska Ocean Acidification Network has been on automatic pilot while Darcy is on a two-month leave of absence. She returns in September and will be working remotely from Germany!

Alaska Water Level Watch (AWLW)

The Alaska Division of Geological & Geophysical Surveys works with Alaska Water Level Watch partners to maintain photos and resources on historical floods in western Alaska. These data are available in multiple formats, including the DGGS photo database, DGGS reports, and now the AWLW Data Portal. Flood heights, impact levels, and photos can be viewed as a data layer in the data portal map view using the Flood Events dataset.

AOOS Managerial

- The July Semi-Annual report for the new cooperative agreement was completed and submitted to the IOOS program office.
- Work continues on the NOAA Infrastructure Investments and Jobs Act proposal with a budget of \$1.9M with an intent to submit in early September.
- Megan Onders joined AOOS July 18 as Director of Ocean Engagement and works between Anchorage and Nome.
- AOOS Supported ANSEP Intern: This summer, AOOS is supporting a student from the Alaska Native Science and Engineering Program to work on a sleeper shark research project under the direction of Dr. Markus Horning (Wildlife Technology Frontiers).
